Road Safety Reminders - walking to school

Please continue to remind your children of the importance of road safety when they are walking to and from school, particularly in bad weather, and particularly if they are unaccompanied. We also ask that you encourage your children to use the zebra crossings whenever possible as these are the safest places to cross around the busy school vicinity. We are aware of an increasing number of 'near misses' and each year group will be spoken to in their Key Stage assemblies, to remind them of their Green Cross Code.



Road Safety Reminders - staff car park

May we politely remind all parents/carers that the staff car park should not be used as a drop off, car park or cut through in the mornings or at the end of the day without prior consent from the Headteacher. In the interest of keeping ALL of our children and families safe, no vehicles, apart from staff vehicles or school transport should use the staff car park, due to the large volume of pedestrians crossing at the entrance and exit at these extremely busy times of the day. We have had reports of at least one recent near miss with a pupil whilst cars were waiting to exit the car park and we will not put our pupils or families at risk. As a result, the entrance and exit will now be coned and we ask that these measures are respected. We will be monitoring the situation and your cooperation is appreciated.
