






# Writing

- Writing is taught daily in writing sessions and across other curriculum areas.
- Writing blocks are linked to our projects.
- There is a balance of fiction and non-fiction.
- Fiction blocks are based on rich texts.











## Assessment in writing

- The children will become more familiar with the standards as we move through the year.
- They will know what they need to do to be judged as 'expected' or 'greater depth' writers when teachers assess their writing in the second half of the year.




#### Working at the expected standard

The pupil can:

- write effectively for a range of purposes and audiences, selecting language that shows good awareness of the reader (e.g. the use of the first person in a diary; direct address in instructions and persuasive writing)
- · in narratives, describe settings, characters and atmosphere
- integrate dialogue in narratives to convey character and advance the action
- select vocabulary and grammatical structures that reflect what the writing requires, doing this mostly appropriately (e.g. using contracted forms in dialogues in narrative; using passive verbs to affect how information is presented; using modal verbs to suggest degrees of possibility)
- use a range of devices to build cohesion (e.g. conjunctions, adverbials of time and place, pronouns, synonyms) within and across paragraphs
- use verb tenses consistently and correctly throughout their writing
- use the range of punctuation taught at key stage 2 mostly correctly<sup>^</sup> (e.g. inverted commas and other punctuation to indicate direct speech)
- spell correctly most words from the year 5 / year 6 spelling list,\* and use a dictionary to check the spelling of uncommon or more ambitious vocabulary
- maintain legibility in joined handwriting when writing at speed.<sup>2</sup>

## Handwriting

- To achieve the expected standard, children must 'maintain legibility in joined handwriting when writing at speed'.
- Handwriting is taught constantly.
- Goosewell children use a cursive font.
- All children reverted to pencil last week and pen licences will be given when children have demonstrated the required standard.
- We provide handwriting pens but children can also bring in their own blue pens.



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

## Reading

- Reading is taught through everything we do at Goosewell.
- Focused reading sessions take place for three hours a week.





# Reading for pleasure

- Children are encouraged to read for pleasure through Accelerated Reader and daily 3pm reads.
- Children need to read every day at home and quiz regularly (at home or in school).
- Certificates are awarded each time children achieve given word counts.
- If your child becomes a member of the 'Millionaire Club', they will receive a free book from our vending machine.
- A reading award is given once a week in the Celebration Assembly.



### Assessment in reading

- AR quizzes
- STAR reading assessments each term ZPD
- SAT reading paper
- > 60 minutes
- 3 texts
- > 50 marks



### SPaG

- Spelling, punctuation and grammar
- Spelling sessions on Mondays ten words set (word lists for Terms I and 2 have been sent home and can be found on the school website)
- Spelling tests on Fridays scores shared via Teams 'assignments'
- SPaG is taught in specific sessions and drip-fed throughout the curriculum.



### Assessment in SPaG

- SAT papers
- Paper I (punctuation and grammar) 45 minutes to answer questions (worth 50 marks)
- Paper 2 children are tested on 20 spellings which follow the patterns taught throughout the year (20 marks)



### Maths

- We cover the objectives as outlined in the National Curriculum using a mastery approach.
- Links are made to real life scenarios and practical resources are used.
- Fluency skills are taught and practised through regular arithmetic assessments and morning tasks.
- Online learning tasks using My Maths will be set every Friday for the following Friday. The first due date will be <u>22/9/23.</u>



#### Assessment in maths

- SAT papers
- Paper I Arithmetic 30 minutes (40 marks)
- Paper 2 Reasoning 40 minutes (35 marks)
- Paper 3 Reasoning 40 minutes (35 marks)



### SATs

- SATs will take place Monday to Thursday during the week commencing 13<sup>th</sup> May 2024.
- Assessment weeks are planned throughout the year to prepare children. Each time we complete a mock SAT assessment, you will receive an updated copy of your child's scores. Please see the following page for an example so you know what to look out for.
- Revision and support will be in place.



#### Year 6 Individual Assessment Tracker

Name:

Scaled Scores (SS)

A scaled score of less than 100 means you are working towards the expected standard.

A scaled score of 100 to 109 means you are working at the expected standard.

A scaled score of 110 or more means you are working at a greater depth standard.

Reading

Each year, once the SAT papers are marked, the government decide on the number of raw marks required to reach the Year 6 standard. All raw scores are then converted into scaled scores. The expected standard for Year 6 is a scaled score of 100 and 110 for greater depth.

Therefore, a scaled score of 99 does not necessarily mean that a child is one test mark away from 100: they could be up to 5 test marks away. Each year the conversions vary slightly.

#### Key Stage 2

#### For PE

After taking feedback from parents and staff, there will be a **small change in the PE uniform** to take full effect from *September 2024*. There will be a phased transition to the new PE uniform from September 2023 to allow parents/carers to make full use of perfectly good uniform that may have already been sourced. By September 2024, all children will be wearing the new PE uniform.

Since Covid-19, we have encouraged children to wear their PE uniform all day. This has been beneficial for all: it has ensured that lesson time is maximised and has meant a reduction in lost property. To bring our PE uniform in line with our school uniform, we would like to introduce a **royal blue hoodie/sweatshirt** rather than the current navy blue and **black bottoms** (tracksuit bottoms, leggings, shorts).

We are committed to ensuring that our students' uniform is smart, practical, hard-wearing and represents good value for money by using our trusted provider Mapac. The new hoodie/sweatshirt is now available on our school website: School Uniform. We have also attached examples of the hoodie/sweatshirt should you wish to find cheaper alternatives without the Goosewell logo. We have checked that appropriate items are available in supermarkets and online.

- Black shorts and blue t-shirt with new logo (PE)
- Navy sweatshirt and jogging bottom/tracksuit trousers (Games) with a phased transition to the new PE uniform from September 2023 to take full effect from September 2024 (see above).
- Trainers or plimsolls for outdoor games
