# PE/Games Kit Expectations

Children should **only** be wearing the following kit for PE and Games:

- Black shorts and blue t-shirt with new logo (PE)
- Navy sweatshirt and jogging bottom/tracksuit trousers (Games) - with a phased transition to the new PE uniform from September 2023 to take full effect from September 2024 (see above).
- Trainers or plimsolls for outdoor games

After taking feedback from parents and staff, as previously communicated there will be a **small change in the PE uniform** to take full effect from *September 2024*. There will be a phased transition to the new PE uniform from September 2023 to allow parents/carers to make full use of perfectly good uniform that may have already been sourced. By September 2024, all children will be wearing the new PE uniform.

Since Covid-19, we have encouraged children to wear their PE uniform all day. This has been beneficial for all: it has ensured that lesson time is maximised and has meant a reduction in lost property. To bring our PE uniform in line with our school uniform, we would like to introduce a **royal blue hoodie/sweatshirt** rather than the current navy blue and **black bottoms** (tracksuit bottoms, leggings, shorts).

We are committed to ensuring that our students' uniform is smart, practical, hard-wearing and represents good value for money by using our trusted provider Mapac. The new hoodie/sweatshirt is now available on our school supplier website: [School Uniform](#). 
This year Goosewell Primary Academy has joined forces with [Plymouth Foodbank](#) and [Plymouth Soup Run](#).
