



## Year Group News

**Foundation Stage** Aliens and planets have descended on Reception and the children have had lots of fun creating and naming their own aliens as well as using junk modelling to create spaceships. Some have written lists for what they might take into space and there has been much talk of Janet and Bill, the main characters from 'The Smeds and the Smoos'. We have written about what makes our classmates special in a very thoughtful way. Next week, we will continue to use this super story as a focus. We will be making and tasting alien food such as the fruit from the 'Jerberry tree' and pink milk. We will explore counting in groups of two and telling stories to demonstrate doubling as well as continuing to consolidate the children's understanding of teen numbers.

**Year 1** We are now moving away from writing Non-Chronological Reports into thinking about how traditional tales are written. We are going to be focussing on the story of Rapunzel because of its links with our castles and towers topic. We will be mapping out the story, thinking about settings and characters and eventually writing our own version. In Maths we will be subtracting. To begin with we won't be crossing ten ( $9-5=$ ) and towards the end of next week we will be crossing ten ( $16-7=$  or  $24-18=$ ). Children will need to start thinking about exchanging tens for ones and so on. Exciting stuff! In our DT sessions, we will be finishing off and adding the final touches to our cereal box castles and then displaying them for all to enjoy. As always, please ensure your child has their RWI phonic pack on the correct day and hands their homework book in on a Thursday. Many thanks.

**Year 2** Next week, as part of our Tower, Tunnels and Turrets topic, the children in Y2 will be making their own towers that they have designed for Rapunzel. In order to do this, could the children bring in any clean junk modelling items from home on Monday? This would be empty cereal boxes, foil boxes and tubes, clean empty cartons and large yoghurt pots. We look forward to showing off our creations by the end of the term! The children will be completing past SAT papers in both reading and maths next week, to show areas that may still need practise and any gaps in their knowledge. Next week's spelling rule that we will be learning is /el/. We will be starting a new reading text called 'The Princess and the Pea' by Lauren Child, where the children will be learning new vocabulary, predicting story outcomes and compiling a list of the qualities a REAL princess should have. We will also look forward to receiving the DT project castles the children have been busy making at home, by the end of the week.

**Year 3** Year 3 have enjoyed finding out about volcanoes this week as part of our Tremors topic. We have also been thinking about earthquakes and instructional writing, ready to write our own set of earthquake safety instructions next week. Within our Maths lessons we will begin to look at money, focusing on the value of coins and converting from pounds to pence. Please take some time to look at and discuss the money you are using while you are out and about this weekend. In our reading lessons we will begin to look at the book 'The Street Beneath my Feet' we will be predicting what we think it is about and spending time looking at the vocabulary choices made by the author.

**Year 4** Now we know the parts of the digestive system, next week we will be exploring it in more gory detail and will also be revealing the results of our tooth enamel investigation. Which liquid would the Demon Dentist advise us to drink?! In English, we will begin to familiarise ourselves with a spooky story inspired by The Demon Dentist - a shared text we are reading in class. We will have a particular focus on a short story called 'The Hook'. We will immerse ourselves within that plot and get to know the characters to unpick the features that make up a really spooky tale! In Maths, we will be developing our understanding of fractions and making our own fraction walls in order to find equivalents and explore the relationship between their denominators.

**Year 5** We hope that you enjoyed reading the fantasy stories, which your children have brought home recently. We were very pleased with the final written outcomes and how well the children took ownership to edit and improve their writing. This week in English, we have started to focus on the art of persuasion. Can your child persuade you why they should eat jelly twice a day? In the coming weeks, we will be writing formal and informal persuasive letters linked to our core text of 'Tom's Midnight Garden'. In Maths, we have been using the formal method of multiplication to multiply 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers. More recently, we have moved on to the inverse operation, using the bus stop method to divide 4 digits by 1 digit. 5S have enjoyed their week of Outdoor Learning and all children continue to enjoy Jump Start Johnny! As part of our Time Traveller topic, we have been learning about how Plymouth has changed over time. It would be brilliant if you could talk to your child / grandchild about the changes that you have seen in our city over the years.

## EduSpot and SchoolMoney

It has come to our attention that some parents/carers may be experiencing difficulties with logins and passwords for SchoolMoney and we understand your frustrations when trying to pay for your children's activities online. We have been in consultation with SchoolMoney to alleviate these issues, and they have provided a list of troubleshooting ideas to try in the first instance if you are experiencing problems:

- Make sure that the parent is selecting the SchoolMoney log in option when signing in. If they are being asked for a username and password, they have selected the incorrect log in option.
- Check that the mobile number and email address match with what you have on your SchoolMoney system (check for spelling, duplicate letters, etc)
- Check that they are entering the child's name as it appears on your system
- Make sure the parent is not Auto filling any of the information and that they are typing everything in from scratch
- Ask the parent to clear their history/cache from the device they are using. If they search how to do this on the internet, it will give them instructions for their device/browser.
- Ask the parent to try a different device/browser
- Make sure the parent isn't keeping the website up in the background on their phone. Advise them to close all web pages open in the background and to open a fresh web page every time they log in
- If a parent has forgotten their password, they will need to contact the school and ask them to send a 'Reset Password Link Message' for the parent to be able to reset their password.


